PAD - Are You at Risk?

Do you experience leg pain while walking or exercising? This could be a sign of Peripheral Artery Disease (PAD). The most common symptom of PAD is a painful muscle cramping in the hips, thighs or calves when walking, climbing stairs or exercising. The pain of PAD usually goes away when you stop exercising, although this may take a few minutes. Working muscles need more blood flow. Resting muscles can get by with less. Many people with PAD have no symptoms or mistake their symptoms for something else. People with peripheral arterial disease have four to five times more risk of heart attack or stroke. Left untreated, PAD can lead to gangrene, amputation, heart attack and stroke.

What is Peripheral Artery Disease (PAD)?

Peripheral Artery Disease happens when fatty deposits build up in arteries outside the heart, usually the arteries supplying fresh oxygen and blood to the arms, legs and feet. PAD is dangerous because these blockages can restrict circulation to the limbs and organs. Without adequate blood flow, the kidneys, legs, arms and feet suffer damage. Left untreated, the tissue can die or harbor infection such as gangrene.

PAD is a life-threatening condition that can be managed or even reversed with proper care.

Risk Factors

Certain risk factors for PAD can't be controlled, such as aging or having a personal or family history of PAD, cardiovascular disease or stroke. However, there are risk factors you CAN control including:

- If you smoke, you have an especially high risk for PAD.
- If you have diabetes, you have an especially high risk for PAD.
- People with high blood pressure or high cholesterol are at risk for PAD.



Get Tested!

NorthPointe is home to the PADnet machine which provides a pain free screening for PAD. The test is run in the office and the results are transferred over the Internet confidentially to a group of cardiologists who read the test, in addition to our own experts. According to Dr. Frederick, physician at NorthPointe, "The PADnet machine is an integral tool in screening for vascular disease and provides an indication of the likelihood of cardiovascular disease. It has been found that 35% of people who have vascular disease also suffer from cardiovascular disease."

Fact or Fiction? Fungal Toenails Are Contagious ... **FICTION!**



Fungal infection of the nail, or onychomycosis, is often ignored because the infection can be present for years without causing any pain. Unlike the common cold or flu, being around someone afflicted with this condition generally does not pose a risk of acquiring the infection.

The disease is characterized by a progressive change in a toenail's quality and color, which is often ugly and embarrassing, however, not usually contagious from casual contact. In reality, the condition is an infection underneath the surface the nail caused by fungi.
